Provide therapy dog training for Read to Rover and Pets to People programs

35 dedicated volunteer teams (person and dog) were active in our outreach programs.

Read to Rover: 25 regular and 5 substitute teams (person and dog) serving students at Chimacum Creek Primary School and Grant Street Elementary;

Pets to People: 6 active teams made regular visits to Life Care Center, Seaport Landing and Victoria Place;

Quilcene Schools initiated a Read to Rover program with 4 teams trained through OMPP therapy dog program.

Ginger's Fund – helping fund emergency treatment for animals from low-income clients

32 animals were helped in 2016. Since inception in 2003, 550 animals have been helped through Ginger's Fund at a cost of \$60,000
