


Pet Pals Therapy Dogs Wish You Happy Holidays

Early Success of Pet Pals Support for Low Income Spay and Neuter Clinics

This month we are celebrating! Our vision of regular, low-cost spay/neuter clinics for lower-income Jefferson County residents is coming true. This month our funding will support three clinics - two at Center Valley Animal Rescue (CVAR) and one at the Humane Society of Jefferson County (HSJC), providing clients with low or no-cost spay/neuter surgeries. Early numbers show that our funds are going almost four times farther than they did in the past with our private vet clinic vouchers. And MORE animals are being served! Because our funds are not being depleted so quickly, we are confident that we can ensure continuation of these services for the long term and meet the needs of our community.

We are excited to be working as a team with the other non-profit animal organizations in our community for the benefit of companion animals and their families. Our partners provide many other essential services to animals but money donated to OMPP will be used ONLY for supporting low-income community spay/neuter services. Thanks to your support, our vision has become a reality.
