Pet Pals Helps Low-income Households Spay or Neuter Their Pets - Over 350 Animals in 2020

Preliminary numbers show that Pet Pals helped spay and neuter 349 animals for lower income Jefferson County residents in 2020. This total includes 232 at private veterinary clinics throughout the year and 117 through s/n clinics that we funded with our partners, Center Valley Animal Rescue and the Humane Society of Jefferson County, in October, November and December. We are encouraged by this number, which is one of our highest totals since we began in 2002. In addition, we spayed or neutered 17 community cats in 2020.
