Our Goal: To Keep Supporting Low Income Spay and Neuter in More Sustainable Way

For the past year, the Pet Pals Board of Directors have been discussing better ways of providing service to our low-income spay/neuter clients. Costs have risen and our income has not kept up with the expenses involved in issuing client vouchers for private veterinary clinics. We have also struggled with the increasing amount of work required of our small group of volunteers to make our programs run smoothly.

After several strategic planning sessions and discussions with other animal non-profits, we are happy to announce that we are partnering with the Humane Society of Jefferson County and Center Valley Animal Rescue to provide a new and more cost-effective model for providing spay/neuter services to low-income community residents. With our financial support, both entities will be able to provide regular clinics for low-income Jefferson County residents starting this October and will perform spay/neuter surgery as well as providing vaccinations, micro-chips, and other services. The community (feral) cat program will also be continued.

Our local veterinarians have made it possible for us to spay and neuter over 7,000 animals over the past 20 years. We are incredibly grateful for their support but are now looking forward to working with our new partners to provide services at a lower cost per animal to a wider range of clients. We will be providing more details in the weeks to come.
