Consider Supporting Spay/Neuter Clinics


Since 2001, one mission of the Olympic Mountain Pet Pals has been to fund spay and neuter operations for the dogs and cats of lower income residents in Jefferson County. Over the years, we have supported over 9000 spay/neuter procedures (including feral cats). Think of all the unwanted litters our efforts have prevented! This reduces the burden of overcrowding at our local animal shelters. In addition, the families in our community who have benefitted from these services have ensured better and healthier lives for their pets. Pet Pals remains committed to funding low income spay/neuter services.

The Good News

In 2020, we began seeing an escalation in the prices of spay/neuter operations at local veterinary hospitals. Our solution has been to partner with the Humane Society of Jefferson County and Center Valley Animal Rescue to provide a new and more cost-effective model for funding spay/neuter services through regularly scheduled clinics. This has proved to be a highly successful approach. We've kept up with increased need for low-income spay/neuter operations while significantly reducing the average cost of each operation.

The Bad News

We can only keep up this level of success as long as our donations keep up with the demand and, unfortunately, our donations have dropped more than 44% this year. Since the bulk of our annual budget goes to these services, a drop in donations risks our ability to continue providing this financial assistance at our partners' clinics.



Unsustainable deficit between donation income and expenditures on S/N clinics may limit the number of S/N operations we can provide in the future.

We understand the economy is shaky and there are many causes worthy of your support. Please remember that providing low cost spay/neuter services makes a great difference for many, many families and pets in our local community. We operate solely on donations from the community and we have no paid staff or office. Please, consider supporting our all-volunteer organization as we continue working to make Jefferson County a better place for animals and their families.

Time for Holiday Baking?

Holiday Dog Cookies

Ingredients:

3 cups brown rice flour

1 teas cinnamon

1/4 cup peanut butter

2 eggs

2 cups cooked down pumpkin

Instructions

- 1. 1. Heat oven to 350 F
- 2. Stir all ingredients in a bowl until dough forms
- 3. Roll portions of dough on floured surface with rolling pin to 1/2 inch thickness. Cut with cookie cutters of your choice. Place cookies 1 inch apart on cookie sheet lined with parchment paper.
- 4. Bake 35 to 40 minutes until dry and golden brown
- 5. Cool completely, about 30 minutes.

Can be stored at room temperature for a week - longer than that, freeze for later.

Ingredients:

1 box Jiffy Corn Muffin Mix

1 egg

1 lb liver (chicken or beef)

garlic powder

1 cup grated cheese (your choice)

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 F.
- 2. Grease 9x11 inch cookie sheet with raised edges.
- 3. Mix together corn mix, egg, and liver in food processor until batter is thick.
- 4. Pour batter into cookie sheet.
- 5. Sprinkle with garlic powder and cheese.
- 6. Bake 15 minutes.

Can keep in refrigerator for 4-5 days or freeze for later.
